# Mindfulness Room: Focused Fundraising

A dedicated fundraising effort this year allowed us to enrich the Mindfulness Room, providing an even more calming and supportive space for students to breath and have awareness. This initiative underscores our commitment to supporting emotional well-being and nurturing a vibrant, inclusive, and supportive environment where students can thrive in every aspect.



The 2023-24 school year at Golden Valley Orchard School was a year of growth, community engagement, and a renewed commitment to holistic, Waldorf-inspired education. Seasonal festivals such as Courage Day, the Winter Gathering/Bowls for Peace, the May Festival, and the Journey Around the World, a multi-cultural festival, brought the community together to celebrate diversity and promote global awareness. Events like the Goldenstock Talent Show and the Annual Concert further highlighted student creativity and teamwork, exemplifying the school's Core Value of Creating Community.

A significant milestone of the year was the inaugural Ruby Bridges Walk, which honored the civil rights icon's legacy and demonstrated the powerful impact that even young individuals can have. This event inspired students to embrace courage and social responsibility, reflecting the school's dedication to fostering meaningful connections with history and values.

The school community also focused on enhancing the campus environment. A watershed grant allowed for the expansion of the school garden, giving students opportunities for hands-on learning in sustainability and nature. Meanwhile, a Chalk It Up grant transformed the playground into a more colorful and welcoming space for student enjoyment. A focused fundraising effort enriched the Mindfulness Room, creating a calm and supportive environment where students could practice emotional balance and self-awareness.

The implementation of the Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) system further reinforced the school's nurturing atmosphere. Faculty and parents worked together to encourage respectful interactions and a shared sense of responsibility, fostering a positive and supportive environment for all.








Golden Valley Charter Schools operated on a budget of approximately \$9 million this year. Of our total revenue, 94% came from public funding, primarily from the State of California. Thanks to the expansion of our meal program, we also received increased federal reimbursements for providing meals to low-income families.

The remaining 3% of our revenue came from generous parent contributions, including donations through the Annual Giving Campaign and support from the Golden Valley Educational Foundation.

Like most nonprofit organizations, the majority of our expenses, 70%, were dedicated to employee wages, pensions, and health care. We also paid 8% of our budget in rent to San Juan Unified School District for the use of our school sites.

A hallmark of Waldorf education is the emphasis on hands-on, artistic learning, which necessitates a substantial investment in classroom materials. This year, we spent \$635,000 on student supplies. In addition, special education services, professional consultants, and other administrative costs totaled \$1.34 million.

Overall, it cost approximately \$200,000 more to operate Golden Valley than we received in funding. Despite this gap, we ended the year with a positive balance of \$768,522 in our accounts, reflecting careful financial management and community support.

# **Annual Giving Campaign**

Our Annual Giving Campaign (AGC) is our yearly cornerstone fundraiser and has a direct impact on our operations budget and program offerings. Financial contributions are vital in sustaining our depth and quality of programs. A high GVCS family participation percentage qualifies our schools to be considered for grants and loans and will assist us in our charter renewal.

## **Fundraisers**

The Golden Valley Educational Foundation (GVEF) is a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit made up of dedicated volunteer parents from both Golden Valley schools. This group is committed to raising supplemental funds to support the operational budget of Golden Valley Charter Schools (GVCS). This year, through volunteer-created and supported fundraising efforts, GVEF raised a total of \$167,398, and granted GVCS \$128,459 for the 2023-2024 fiscal year. These funds help sustain Waldorf-inspired programs by covering key expenses such as rent, teacher


